Tidbit From the Past – I recently acquired a reprint of an 1899 book, <u>A History of Wireless</u> <u>Telegraphy, 1838-1899</u> by J. J. Fahie, and found this interesting excerpt from an old presentation. W. H. Preece, an early pioneer in wireless telegraphy and at that time engineerin-chief of the postal telegraphs in Britain, made these comments at a Society of Arts meeting on February 23, 1894, exactly 115 years ago, today.

"Although this short paper is confined to a description of a simple practical system of communicating across terrestrial space, one cannot help speculating as to what may occur through planetary space. Strange mysterious sounds are heard on all long telephone lines when the earth is used as a return, especially in the calm stillness of night. Earth-currents are found in telegraph circuits and the aurora borealis lights up our northern sky when the sun's photosphere is disturbed by spots. The sun's surface must at such times be violently disturbed by electrical storms, and if oscillations are set up and radiated through space, in sympathy with those that affect telephones, it is not a wild dream to say that we may hear on this earth a thunderstorm in the sun."
